WHAT IS THE PROJECT ABOUT?

The project aims to cater to the educational needs of young individuals by offering e-learning opportunities to develop their professional, entrepreneurial, and digital skills within the cultural and creative industries. It utilizes creative and innovative technologies to accomplish this goal. The primary focus is reaching out to youth who have limited access to educational opportunities or are unemployed (NEETs). However, the project is designed to be applicable and beneficial to the broader youth population interested in pursuing education and employment in this specific field.

WHAT HAVE WE DONE SO FAR?

Following the creation of the EPICURIOUS EU Report that compiles valuable insights about the Cultural and Creative Industries (CCI) and the Creative Economy among seven European Union countries, we held a transnational partner meeting in Amsterdam, the Netherlands on September 28th in order to plan and schedule further steps. After the meeting, the consortium prepared the educational material and resources for the following topics which the EPICURIOUS project covers: music, writing, handcraft, visual arts, digital skills and technology and film and media. The consortium also created a training methodology to ensure a quality and valuable training offer on the topics mentioned above. These documents together form the Entrepreneurship skills Manual.

The EPICURIOUS consortium is currently in the process of piloting our developed educational material and resources with the project's target groups consisting of youth and youth trainers/educators.
